Today's readings speak of humility-perhaps an unfashionable topic in our modern age. In the first reading, we learn that "many are lofty and renowned, but to the humble the Lord reveals his secrets... by the humble he is glorified." A humble heart is a listening heart, one that will hear the voice of God.

We see in the second reading, the letter to the Hebrews, that Christ is the mediator through whom all will be saved. We need look no further, for we have Christ guiding us to a better future, if we but listen to his voice and follow him.

Moreover, Luke's Gospel today clearly shows the kind of humility we are called to as followers of Jesus. It means putting ourselves last and helping the poor and marginalized first. We may not be conscious of the poor in our midst and may even feel superior because of our perceived successes and others' failures. In my work with the St. Vincent de Paul Society, I see people's resilience and gratitude, despite their myriad problems. If I were in their situation, I am not sure I could be as courteous and resourceful. There is no doubt that God invites us to have a humble heart, willing to help others no matter their health, wealth and social status.
